BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF PLACES OF VISIT	
AL HARAM GUIDED TOUR	
Shubaikah	An entrance into Makkah once used by travellers arriving quietly, often at night. Some narrations mention the Prophet ﷺ entering from this direction. It reflects how revelation entered a city slowly, before transforming it completely.
House of Abu Bakr RA	Near the Haram once stood the home of Abu Bakr As-Siddiq, where early Islam found refuge. It was here that the Prophet ﷺ planned the Hijrah. This home became a quiet command centre of faith under pressure.
Dar Al Arqam	The first "school of Islam," where the Prophet ﷺ taught secretly to a handful of believers. Owned by Al-Arqam ibn Abi Al-Arqam, a young companion. Here, faith was nurtured before it was declared.
Mount Safa	Where the Prophet ﷺ first publicly called Quraysh to Islam. It is also where Hajar (AS) ran in desperation. One place, two stories: a mother's trust and a Prophet's call.
Jabal Abi Qubais	A mountain overlooking the Ka'bah. Some reports mention it as the site where the moon was split as a sign. A mountain that has stood strong across generations, witnessed both miracles of the Prophet ﷺ and people's rejection of him ﷺ.
Shi'ib Banu Hashim	A narrow valley where the Prophet ﷺ and his clan were boycotted for nearly three years. Hunger, isolation, and resilience lived here. Less known: leaves and leather were eaten to survive.
Prophet's Birth Place ﷺ	The location where the final Messenger ﷺ entered the world. Though the structure has changed over time, the moment it marks changed the course of humanity.

Saidatina Khadijah's RA House	The home of Khadijah bint Khuwaylid — where revelation first descended, and where the Prophet ﷺ found comfort. Many of his children were born here. The first sanctuary of Islam.
MAKKAH GUIDED TOUR	
Masjidil Haram	The heart of the world's worship — built around the Ka'bah raised by Prophet Ibrahim (AS). Every step here connects to centuries of tawhid.
Jabal Thawr	The cave where the Prophet ﷺ and Abu Bakr RA hid during Hijrah. A spider's web and a bird's nest became part of divine protection — teaching us that means are small, but Allah's protection is vast.
Jabal Rahmah (Arafah)	The plain where Hajj culminates. Standing here echoes the Day of Judgment.
Hajj Route (Mina - Arafah - Muzdalifah)	A physical journey mirroring submission — footsteps retracing the legacy of Ibrahim (AS), Hajar (AS), and Ismail (AS).
Jabal Nur (Cave Hira)	Where revelation began. The Prophet ﷺ would retreat here in reflection before Prophethood. The first word "Read" descended here — changing history.
Wahyu Museum	A modern effort to document the journey of revelation — tracing where verses descended and how the Qur'an was preserved.
Qur'an Museum	A space to appreciate the compilation, preservation, and transmission of the Qur'an — from oral tradition to written mushaf.
NABAWI GUIDED TOUR	
Masjid Nabawi	Built by the Prophet ﷺ himself upon arrival in Madinah. It was not just a mosque, but a centre of governance, learning, and community.
Baq'i Cemetery	The resting place of many companions and family members, including Fatimah bint Muhammad (RA). A quiet reminder of the akhirah beside the Prophet's ﷺ mosque.
Saqifah Bani Sa'idah	Where the companions gathered after the Prophet's ﷺ passing and pledged allegiance to Abu Bakr RA — ensuring unity of the ummah.
Masjid Al Ghamamah	Where the Prophet ﷺ is reported to have performed Eid and prayed for rain (istisqa'). A place of communal du'a.
Masjid Abu Bakr As-Siddiq	Commemorates where Abu Bakr RA led prayers — symbolising continuity after Prophethood.
Masjid 'Ali Ibn Abi Talib	Linked to Ali ibn Abi Talib (RA), reflecting his closeness to the Prophet ﷺ and his role in the early ummah.
Masjid 'Umar Ibn Al-Khattab	Associated with Umar ibn Al-Khattab (RA), whose leadership expanded Islam beyond Arabia.

Masjid 'Uthman Ibn 'Affan	Linked to Uthman ibn Affan (RA), known for compiling the Qur'an into a unified mushaf.
MADINAH GUIDED TOUR	
Masjid Quba'	The first mosque built in Islam. The Prophet ﷺ would visit it regularly. Praying here carries the reward of an 'umrah.
Aris (Khatam) Well	Where the Prophet ﷺ once sat, and where his ring (seal) later fell during 'Uthman's RA time. A small well tied to a moment of quiet loss.
Saba' Masajid (Battle of Khandaq)	Marking the site of the trench battle — where Madinah was defended through strategy and unity. Less known: Salman Al-Farisi RA suggested the trench.
Masjid Qiblatayn	Where the qiblah changed from Jerusalem to Makkah during prayer — marking a shift in identity for the Muslim ummah.
Dates Farm	More than agriculture — dates sustained Madinah. The Prophet ﷺ emphasised their barakah, especially ajwa dates.
Jabal Uhud & Cemetery	Where the Battle of Uhud took place. The Prophet ﷺ said, "Uhud loves us and we love it." Many martyrs, including Hamza ibn Abdul-Muttalib (RA), rest here.
Archers' Mount (Jabal Ruma)	Where a small group's disobedience changed the course of battle — a powerful lesson on obedience and consequences.
Masjid Al Fash	A lesser-known site near Uhud where the Prophet ﷺ prayed during the battle. A place of refuge amidst chaos.
Ghars Well	Ghars Well, near Quba in Madinah, is one of the Prophet's ﷺ historic wells. Authentic narrations report that he drank from its water, performed wudhu' with it, prayed for its blessing, and requested that water from it be used to wash his blessed body after his passing.
Garden of Salman Al Farisi RA	Linked to Salman al-Farisi (RA), whose journey to Islam spanned continents. The Prophet ﷺ helped plant date palms here to free him from slavery.
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
